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Jr. Ag Mechanics Silent Auction

Vocational Students who want to sell their school welding or woodworking projects at the Colusa County Fair, can do so by participating in the Jr. Ag Mechanics Silent Auction. The auction runs from opening of the Fair, Thursday, June 8th, 5:00 p.m. until Sunday, June 11th, 6:00 p.m. .

Students who want to sell their welding or woodworking projects at the Silent Auction must adhere to the following conditions:

- 1. Projects to be auctioned must be entered in this years Jr. Ag Mechanics Department and Divisions and awarded a 1st place.*
- 2. Students must notify their Ag Instructor of their decision to sell and submit a value price and a starting bid price for each auction entry. Exhibitors/or Ag Instructors will provide the required information with the entry at time the exhibit is received, Sunday June 5th, 2016.*
- 3. All projects sold will be assessed an auction cost fee of 7%, with a cap of \$35.00. (For example, if an item exceeds \$500.00, the commission will only be \$35.00.) Students selling projects are encouraged to notify potential bidders of their item (s) in the Silent Auction. Bidders are asked to register and may leave a maximum bid or amount they are willing to pay on file with the person on duty in the Atwood Hall Building where the Silent Auction will be held.*

Failure to comply with the Silent Auction Rules will result in a student's ineligibility to participate in the auction.

Rules:

1. The Junior Agricultural Mechanics Show and Auction will be limited to Colusa County High schools that have Agriculture Mechanics programs.

Each school for the 2017 Colusa County Fair will be limited to no more than five major projects. The committee (comprised of one Ag mechanics instructor from each of the five schools in Colusa County plus two Colusa County Fair representatives, the CEO and a Board member) will make decisions on whether or not a school may bring more than five projects. The 2017 Colusa County Fair will have a limit of twenty-five projects total for the show and auction.

2. Students can enter in either the Ag Mechanics Auction show or the General Agriculture Mechanics show. They can not enter both shows with the same project.

3. A student who is selling an Ag mechanics project may also show a different Ag mechanics project in the general Ag mechanics show.

4. A student may NOT sell in both JLA/Ag Mech. Auctions. They must choose one project to sell in current year.

5. Students will be required to be present for judging in Official FFA Dress with white pants. Students will answer questions posed to them by the judge.

6. An educational display with pictures of the projects progress is encouraged. All projects will be judged by an industry expert, based on the following:

JUDGING CRITERIA BASED ON THE FOLLOWING:

- Quality of workmanship in general
- Worthiness of project for which it was designed
- Layout
- Fit
- Welds
- Grinding
- Finish work, sanding, primer, paint, etc.

WOODWORKING PROJECTS

- Quality of workmanship in general
- Worthiness of project for which it was designed
- Layout
- Fit
- Sanding
- Glue/Fastening
- Finish work, sanding, primer, paint, etc.

Purple Ribbon–Outstanding workmanship and quality

Blue Ribbon–Good workmanship and quality

Red Ribbon–Needs improvement
